



1. RULES

The races will be governed by the rules as defined in the 2009-2012 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2. ENTRIES

The race is open to all single-hulled, auxiliary sailboats, must be helmed by a woman at all times during the race, and carry no more than 50% male crew.

Competitors may enter the race in advance by mail, online at www.monroeboatclub.org, or by delivering a completed entry form along with \$25US to Monroe Boat Club during open registration 10:30-11:30am the morning of the race. Each entry must be accompanied by a current PHRF-LE rating certificate and \$100k liability insurance policy, unless on file at MBC for 2010. A handicap certificate and/or yacht club membership may be waived at the discretion of the Race Chair.

3. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located in the Recreation Room of MBC, and the waterside windows of the club.

4. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted on the official notice board not later than one hour before the affected race.

5. SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

- There will be NO competitors' meeting.
- One race will be held on Sunday, August 1, 2010.
- The scheduled time for the warning signal will be at 12:55pm (~5 min starts)

6. CLASS FLAGS AND ORDER OF STARTS:

7. ON-WATER POSTPONEMENT

Code Flag "AP" and two sound signals. The Warning Signal will be made one minute after lowering the "AP" flag.

8. RACING AREA

The racing area will be western Lake Erie, starting at the "North" mark approximately 1/2 nm southeast of the Bolles Harbor R2 buoy.

9. MARKS

Race marks are orange spar buoys with letters N, S, E, W, C, and "NCYC Racing Mark." The approximate locations of these are:

10. THE START

Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with the warning signal given 5 minutes before the starting signal. The starting line will be between an orange flag on the R/C boat and the North mark. Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area.

11. COURSES

The courses will be triangular. The race committee signal boat will display the selected course, designated by a black number on a white background indicating marks to round no later than the warning signal.

Should conditions warrant, the Race Committee MAY shorten course at a common mark of the course, and will notify yachts by flying code "S" flag accompanied by two sound signals upon approach of the first yacht.

12. RECALLS

The R/C boat will fly the "X" flag and signal in accordance with Rule 29.1, and MAY attempt to notify individual yacht(s) by hail. However, failure of a yacht to hear her recall shall not relieve her of her obligation to start correctly. Starting order will not change. Rule 29.2 does not apply (there will be no general recalls).

13. TIME LIMIT

The time limit for the race will be 2.5 hours from the first start, for the first boat to finish.

14. PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

Protest flags must be flown. Protest forms are available on the official notice board. Protests shall be delivered to MBC sail fleet notice board within 1.0 hour after the race committee/finish boat docks. The protesting yacht must notify the R/C boat at the finish line of her intent to protest and the sail number of the protested yacht. Hearings will be held as soon as possible after racing in clubhouse banquet room. All interested parties must be present. A boat that has taken a penalty under RRS 31.2 or 44.1 shall notify the Race Committee after finishing the race.

15. SCORING

The Low Point System of Appendix A of the RRS will apply.

16. SAFETY

Each competitor is responsible for the personal safety of him/herself. It shall be the sole and inescapable responsibility of the skipper and crew of the yacht to decide whether or not to start, continue, or finish the race.

Retirement: A yacht that retires should notify the Race Committee, verbally or using VHF channel 71, before leaving the racing area. If that is not possible, the yacht shall notify MBC as soon as possible. The club telephone is: (734) 243-8935.

17. COMMUNICATIONS

A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile (cell) telephones. The Race Committee will monitor VHF-71.

19. TROPHIES AND PRIZES

Flags will be awarded to the top three finishers of each class. The perpetual trophy will be engraved naming the top boat in each division.
