MI Travel Counts Survey: The @MITravelCounts survey, sponsored by the MI Dept. of Transportation and SE MI Council of Governments, is designed to improve Michigan's transportation system now and over the next 20 years. Get more information on how your participation is critical and can make a difference for everyone in Michigan. <http://ow.ly/Jg6JU>

How does that happen? Basically, Michigan is required to update statewide and urban long range transportation plans. Travel demand models are the tools used to estimate where future travel in Michigan will occur. The information that MI Travel Counts participants submit is the data on which these models are built.

The estimates gathered from these models are then used as the basis for transportation planning, alternative analysis and setting priorities for future transportation investments. That means the information submitted by participants directly correlates to the selection and prioritization of transportation system improvements that the state enjoys as a whole.

Ultimately, this planning requirement affects how the state prioritizes and allocates limited funding available for transportation improvements. The data gathered in the MI Travel Counts survey will be used to project and budget for transportation improvements across Michigan over the next 20 years. If you are one of the 21,000 Michigan residents selected to participate, please do so.

Again, I hope you all are having as good of a winter as possible, stay warm and have fun! See you around the club!







**Sailor Spotlight (SS:) interview with Bill Huntley**

Another good one was the first time I took my wife out in the Interlake, we were in the channel and ran into the mud. The look of shock on her face when I told her I was going overboard to push us out was priceless. She had a fit and thought it might be well over my head, not just the 3' or so that got us stuck. I also remember a time on my 2<sup>nd</sup> boat, a 24 footer, coming back from Toledo. We had cut pretty close to Turtle Island when I looked up and asked my friend if he thought the ducks were "standing" on the water?!?!? A hard right turn got us out of there safely.

SS: Will you be going on any of the MBC Club cruises or Holiday cruises?

Bill: Yes, I really enjoy going to Port Clinton and will do the Holiday cruises if time permits. Those are great fun, go out with the club for a few hours, come back and have a hot dog.
