Parks and Recreation Commission officially welcomed Michigan's 103rd state park, adding 1,122 acres of new recreational public land in southern Michigan, at a ribbon cutting recently. The park is located just miles from Hayes State Park, Pinckney Recreation Area and Waterloo Recreation Area in southern Michigan. It features beautiful rolling land covered in a mixture of open meadow, mixed hardwoods, low wetland areas and open water.

Snowmobiling...Are you ready? Michigan is known for its abundant snow, exciting terrain and more than 6,200 miles of designated snowmobile trails. Don't be left out in the cold when the snow flies. Purchase your snowmobile trail permit, which is required to operate snowmobiles in the state and valid for one year (Oct. 1 to Sept. 30).
