reetings from your Commodore! This month my entire article is devoted to an organization which many of you have heard of but do not realize the extent of their activities - The Inter-Lake Yachting Association's (I-LYA). I-LYA's mission is the protection and promotion of the interests of boat owners and water sport fans in the enjoyment of their sport. In concert with this mission, the I-LYA hosts three regattas annually; Junior Sailing Regatta, Senior Sailing Regatta, and the Senior and Junior Power Regatta. All three regattas are held at the Put in Bay Yacht Club, Put in Bay (South Bass Island) OH.

The first is the **Junior Sailing Regatta**. The annual Junior Sailing Regatta is one of the largest sailing events in the United States. Juniors, age 7-17, race laser radials, 420s, and Thistles. This year 163 juniors participated. It is a sight to behold to watch the juniors launch their sail boats at 8 am. Over 150 sail boats are launched in 20 minutes. The winners receive scholarships from the I-LYA Yachtsmen's Fund. Additionally junior sailors may participate in the Junior Traveler Series. I-LYA member clubs host the series. Series awards are presented to the top finishing skippers and crew in each qualifying fleet. I-LYA top sailors travel to Area East Qualifiers for the U. S. Junior Sailing Championships.

The **Senior Sailing Regatta**. Racing includes PHRF/JAM around the islands and/or windward/ leeward; one design keelboats around the islands and windward/leeward; one design centerboards/ beach cats modified windward/leeward; and cruising around the islands. Social activities are conducted in the evening such as the Beer Trailer, Rum Party and a variety of dinners each evening.

The **Junior Power Regatta** is scheduled the same week as the Power Regatta. Junior Power contests are designed to reinforce the safe boating practices and rules of the road. Juniors test their boat handling, pass reading, and bearings skills in contests driving inflatables. They also have seminars in charting and course plotting. The navigation competition includes a short course around the island where they take their bearings, make observations, and determine their position. Social competitions for both juniors include the geo-quest, volleyball game, card-board boat race, and fishing derby.

The **Senior Power Regatta** includes contests in docking, chicane, flying mile. Social competitions include inflatable boat races and the cardboard boat races. NOTE: Commodore Kathy and Power Fleet Captain Kristen took FIRST PLACE in the cardboard boat race. (continued next column......)

Regatta-- Thank You!... Since the August Harbor Light column was written prior to the Regatta, I would like to express the CCEC's appreciation for all of you who purchased books, CDs and DVDs. Our appreciation goes especially to Rick Boose for loaning his tent to the CCEC, Barbara Valmassei, Carol and Bill Ducey for setting up the display; Tom and Sue Kozlowski for working with the kids' fishing derby, and Carol Zielinski and Don Blouin for assisting with the book sale.

Unfortunately, the children did not catch one fish, but they were rewarded for their perseverance in "sticking it out" for the full time in 90+ degree sun. MBC also appreciates the support we received from the Department of Natural Resources with the help of three staff from Sterling State Park.

Algal Bloom...In July U-M researchers and their partners predicted less harmful algal bloom for western Lake Erie this year than last year's record setting event. This is partially due to less discharge from the Maumee River and an average nutrient runoff into the lake. The NOAA forecast for late August and September is similar conditions last seen from 2008 to 2010. The main driver of Lake Erie's harmful algal blooms is elevated phosphorus from watersheds draining to the lake's western basin, particularly from the heavily agricultural Maumee River watershed. About 85 percent of the phosphorus entering Lake Erie from the Maumee River comes from agricultural sources. Even though it was early in the season, the water collected by the 7th graders from the MBC boats and tested by the students showed phosphorus levels within normal ranges. We might refine our collection and testing processes and eventually become one of the sources for early predictive testing for phosphorous and nitrates correlating with algal blooms in late summer.

<u>Catch 'em all in Michigan state parks</u> What better way to capture Pikachu or Ivysaur than by exploring Michigan's great outdoors at the same time! The popular Pokémon Go mobile game has visitors of all ages "catching" some fun in Michigan state parks.

Many Michigan state parks have plenty of "PokeStops" and "gyms" for you to discover! There are also plenty of trails if you're looking to hatch that next "egg."
