

MARITIME TRADES CAREER DAY

..will be held again this fall at Monroe Boat Club. We will be hosting 30 10-12th grade students from Monroe High School in the back room on October 9. It will again be co-sponsored by MBC-A in partnership with the Monroe County Intermediate School District and the Monroe High School Career/Technical Education Center. The students will tour and/or hear presentations from the U.S. Coast Guard, the Michigan Industrial Boater's Association, the Port of Monroe, Kustom Marine, Solomon Diving, Trout Yacht Basin, and Toledo Beach Marina. The focus of the day is three-pronged: Economy + Environment = Maritime Jobs. One hundred percent of the students evaluated the day last year as one from which they learned and believed should be offered again.

Thank you all for placing your trust in me these last 2 years as your Dock Master. I have to say this has been one of the most gratifying positions that I have held throughout the years. The amount of help and input that I have received was beyond description! I thank you all for your support and I hope that you will continue your support under the new Dock Master as I will continue to assist in any way that I can.

I would like to acknowledge all dock holders for their help in making space for Bay View Y/C out of Toledo! It would have been a little close as they brought out 17 boats and by the sounds of things on the club grounds...they had fun!

On to new business, the water system will be on through at least the middle of the month of October. However, should temperatures depart below normal, the system may be shut down earlier. Right now, I'm looking at either the 17th or the 24th. So, mark your calendars! Also, as you begin to pull your vessels, make sure that upon pulling your dock posts that they ARE SECURELY FASTENED TO THE DOCK! We've experienced a lot of high water this year and there was a lot of dock posts that got misplaced due to the flooding (floating away). If you need to, use plumbers' tape around your posts and fasten them to the dock in an organized fashion please. This will prevent any posts from finding a different home! The dock posts should not be placed where anyone walking would be affected by them as a trip hazard.

As another early note for all of you, all dock posts must be removed and stored by the second Friday in November which is November 9th (again mark your

MBC Association Update

Next month the MBC-Association will reach its one year anniversary. A detailed annual report will be presented at the Annual Membership meeting in October and a summary will be presented through the Harbor Light article. I have enjoyed the challenge, and I am honored to have served as the non-profit's President during its infancy. I'm smiling thinking about how I did the same thing with another non-profit 20 years ago. In both cases I was able to see, first hand, the many blessings and good things accomplished as the organizations grew. It's all about the many people who make it happen. The MBC-A is beginning to pick up some steam. Many thanks to Don Blouin for managing the Charity Poker events. Charlotte Neuhauser has been diligent at pursuing opportunities and grants for future educational projects. She is at the center of all activities. The Board and Trustees have been instrumental in shaping our future and Mission focus. We have had some lively discussions at the Board meetings and beyond. I feel the team has reached an effectiveness beyond expectation for the first year of operation.

So what has been accomplished all you skeptics may ask? There have been two events this year for the youth, our future. One in June exposing them to the environment around the lakes and the fragile ecosystem that exists in the largest fresh water system in the world. Several members, along with the Stone Lab (OSU) and other agencies participate in this two day event at MBC. The Association is exploring the opportunity to sponsor a fishing club for the local schools. The Rowing event at the Regatta was a blast to watch. Many thanks again to Don, Dave Ryan and the other volunteers, for making this event an enjoyable one for the participants and the spectators. Look for it again next year. These events inspire our youth, make this club attractive to families and most of all makes Monroe Boat Club a participant in the greater Monroe community.

The MBC-A has hosted one Charity Poker event at Woodhaven Lanes. Thank you to the 25 volunteers participating in the first event. There are two more scheduled for this year, 26-29 October and 09-12 November. We are working on the schedule for 2019 at this time and potentially have two dates locked in. These events are providing the seed money for the MBC-A, and funds to use for enhancing Monroe Boat Club. Just this month 8 desktop wireless microphones were purchased and installed.
