Casting for Recovery (CfR) provides healing outdoor retreats for women with breast cancer, at no cost to the participants. CfR's retreats offer opportunities for women to find inspiration, discover renewed energy for life, and experience healing connections with

other women and nature. For women who have had surgery or radiation as part of their breast cancer treatment, the gentle motion of fly casting can be good physical therapy for increasing mobility in the arm and upper body. Couple that with the emotional benefits of connecting with nature, and you've got powerful medicine. CfR currently offers 60 retreats across the country, serving 800+ women

each year. CfR has international program partners in Canada, UK/Ireland, Australia, New Zealand and Italy. Their usual format is 14 women sharing 2 ½ days of a weekend together fly fishing and socializing. MBC-A's proposal is before their National Board as it differs from their format. It suggests a 6-8 week, once per week meeting from 3-8 in the afternoon and the fishing would be lure fishing. It will have a learning-about-fishing period, a fishing period, and a dining/socialization period. We would try to provide this program for those who may have job, children or family responsibilities which prohibit them from going on a weekend retreat, but who can still benefit from the relaxed, nature-focused retreat. If the National Board approves the proposal, I'll be looking for several different types of volunteers-medical-related, fishing related, and boating related. Once approval from the National Board happens, then the complete proposal (physical facilities, budget, resources (grant funding and volunteer) will be presented to the MBC-A and MBC Boards for approval.



Care of the Environment and Our Water We all remember how high the water rose last summer, making it difficult to get on board our boats in many cases. However, please refer to

the chart later in the newsletter that shows 1986-87 was the time when Lake Erie was actually higher. The upper limit on the chart of the projection for this year shows that the water during May could rise as high as it was in 1986-87 but the more likely projection shows it slightly lower than last year in May. Looking at the average of all years during each month, we find the levels of 2017-18 running higher than the averages of past years. (Source: http://lrewm.usace.army.mil/ForecastData/BulletinGraphics/MBOGLWLerie.pdf). As we're all aware, the depth of the water is partially dependent on the amount of rain and snowfall experienced in the northern portions of the state. Overall, the Great Lakes Basin has been generally drier; moreover, precipitation in the Great Lakes basin this month is about 60% of its monthly average as of January 16th, with Lake Erie receiving only 1/3 of its average precipitation this month to date.

- Both Lakes St. Clair and Erie are 9 inches higher than they were at this time last year, Lake St. Clair is expected to rise an inch while Lake Erie's level is projected to be approximately equal to its current level
- Lake Michigan-Huron's outflow into the St. Clair River and the outflow of Lake St. Clair through the Detroit River are projected to be above average.
- Moreover, Lake Erie's outflow through the Niagara River is forecasted to be above average for January.

Regardless, Lake Erie was still nine inches higher on January 18, 2019 than it was on the same date in 2018. We can probably assume that if precipitation remains about the same, the projected change in level of Lake Erie by February 18 will remain about the same and possibly be about the same as last summer. 

Sail Camp consists of one week of daily certified instruction this summer.


