MBC-A (501c3) Update

Update on Environmental Career Day. The days are scheduled for June 4-5. The teachers have told us there are potentially 130 7th graders who will be eligible. We still need 4 more boats each day—either power or sail. At least one more high-performance boat is needed to be used by six students (usually boys) whose lives might be influenced in a positive direction by such an experience. We need volunteers for the following:

- Kitchen and serving—pizza, fruit, cookies, and water/juice are served for lunch. One more person
- 2. A captain and co-captain for each boat—4 more boats each day, preferably the same boats on both days.

 Water quality testing in backroom—a bucket of water is collected by students on each boat and used for testing the quality of the water.

The theme for the day is the sustainability of the environment, and most importantly, the necessity of staying in school, studying hard, graduating, eventually getting the training or education needed for a satisfying job/career, and possibly owning a boat and belonging to MBC. MBC-A Board Meeting: June 15, Saturday, 9:00 am. All members of MBC are invited to attend the quarterly board meetings of MBC-A. I have found in talking with MBC members, many are not aware of the existence and purpose of MBC Association (MBC-A), the 501(c)3 nonprofit affiliated with MBC. In 2009 members of the Club Community Education Events Committee (CCEC) began collaborating with the Knabusch Math Science Center (across the creek from MBC) on the Annual Kids Fishing Derby. Then by 2012 the Environmental Career Day was offered in collaboration with Monroe Junior High.

Some members began asking, "Why does MBC have to offer these programs...we are a private club?" They were correct...this is a private club, but it's also a "boat" club. Our foundation was built on boating. And this leads to a clean, safe, quality place to boat—Lake Erie. Most of us realize that the sustainability of this great asset which we continuously enjoy depends on our stewardship and making sure the generations that follow will care about it as much as we do.


As time went on, we realized we had to have external funding from granting foundations in order to offer these and other programs. Very few foundations grant funds to organizations that are not 501(c)3 nonprofits. In 2017 CCEC split into two entities: CCEC which continues to offer workshops or seminars such as the Customs seminar in May, training on the AED, the book sale at Regatta, and maintenance of the technical/environmental library in the Commodore's Room... and MBC-A with its mission as Providing educational and recreational opportunities associated with fostering the development of a sustainable boating and clean water harbor community, to enhance and protect natural surroundings, and to

provide programs and projects that build environmental and conservation stewardship in youth and adults.

We all are aware that it's difficult to find good people to fix our boats. An article in December 2016 issue of <u>Boat U.S. Magazine</u>, focused on the supply and demand gaps in the maritime trades. This is how it came about that we now offer the Maritime Trades Career Day (MTCD) in September for senior high trades students. In talking with an "old-timer" at Toledo Beach Marina, I asked him, "How do we get kids interested in the maritime trades?" He responded, "Teach them to fish. They'll eventually realize a boat is essential and maintenance comes after that." So that's one of the reasons why we're in the process of getting an elementary school fishing club started.

Talk with some of the MBC members who have volunteered and worked with the kids on these projects. We know from the assessments that the students gain much from the intergenerational interaction and communication, but so many of you have told me that you really enjoyed the opportunity of giving back to the students. We have other projects in the planning process such as "Climate's Relationship to Sailing for 9th-10th graders," "Fishing for Life" for breast cancer survivors, and "Fishing for Life" for PTSD veterans. Please come to our board meetings—we welcome your input and your participation in the projects. We also need your participation in the Charity Poker fund raising which helps with the financial contributions which MBC-A makes to MBC.
