MBC-A (501c3) Update

Update on Environmental Career Day. Our program is scheduled for June 4-5. The teachers have told us there are potentially 130 7th graders who will be eligible. We will need 10 boats each day—both power and sail. At least one high-performance boat is needed to be used by six students (usually boys) whose lives might be influenced

in a positive direction by such an experience. We need volunteers for the following:

 Kitchen and serving—pizza, fruit, cookies, and water/juice are served for lunch.

- General supervising—men's and women's restrooms, moving students between activities
- A captain and co-captain for each boat—10 boats each day, preferably the same boats on both days. Talking with the students about piloting and operation of boat, how you came to be interested in boating, along with pointing out environmental issues, such as trash in the water, street overflow between Trout's and OPM, turtles, birds, algae, etc.
- 4. Water quality testing in backroom—a bucket of water is collected by students on each boat and used for testing the quality of the water. Each table of six students needs an adult supervisor; no experience nor knowledge of water testing are needed, just an interest in helping them get organized if they need it.

The theme for the day is the sustainability of the environment, including the topics of invasive species, good water quality for commercial and recreational purposes, and most importantly, the necessity of staying in school, studying hard, graduating, eventually getting the training or education needed for a satisfying job/career, and possibly owning a boat. Michigan's Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act Changes are focused on preventing the spread of invasive species and supporting natural resources stewardship efforts for the future. In addition to the existing law requiring all aquatic plants be removed from boats and

trailers before launching, the changes require the following, prior to transporting any watercraft over land:

- Remove all drain plugs from bilges, ballast tanks and live wells.
- Drain all water from any live wells and bilges.
- Ensure the watercraft, trailer and any conveyance (vehicle) used to transport the watercraft or trailer are free of aquatic organisms, including plants.

This means after trailering boats and before getting on the road, boaters must pull plugs, drain water and remove plants and debris

from all watercraft, trailers and other conveyances. (Source: Michigan Department of Natural Resources).

Western Lake Erie Cluster Activities. On June 29th, a boat wash, sponsored by the River Raisin Institute and the DEQ will take place at Bolles Harbor Boat Launch. On July 20th, the boat wash will take place at Lake Erie Metropark. On August 10th, the boat wash will take place at Sterling State Park. If you wish to have your boat washed, take it to one of these sites.


The <u>Prairie Restoration Learnshop</u> is set for July 13th at the FCA Dundee Engine Plant in Dundee and will be co-hosted by the Monroe Conservation District and the Oak Openings Green Ribbon Initiative.

<u>Stiltgrass Workshop</u>. Stiltgrass is a new invasive grass that is slowly invading Michigan and has been found in Wayne, Lenawee and other southern counties nearby. So far, none has been verified in Monroe County and we are strongly encouraged to do surveys at nearby parks to ensure it does not spread through our area. The workshop on identifying the grass will be held on June 22nd at the IHM Campus on Elm Street. The plan for the day will be for her to lead a scouting tour after presenting how to identify the new invasive grass.

How to Prepare Boat Shrink Wrap for Recycling in 6 Easy Steps Anyone can recycle their boat's winter shrink wrap

SANDUSKY, Ohio, April 30, 2018 – With recreational boats now waking up from their long winter's nap and their protective shrink wrap covers coming off prior to spring launch, a new <u>video</u> from the <u>Ohio Clean Marinas Program</u> shows boaters everywhere how to prepare boat shrink wrap for recycling in six easy steps.

Essentially plastic, shrink wrap is an effective winter cover, but when disposed of in landfills, it can take hundreds of years to degrade. The <u>BoatUS Foundation for Boating Safety and Clean Water</u> says boaters can learn from Ohio's new video to help easily manage their own vessel's shrink wrap recycling. Each vessel yields about 25 to 35 pounds of shrink wrap. Since 2006, the <u>Buckeye State's recycling program</u> has kept 2.3 million pounds of low-density polyethylene shrink wrap out of landfills, with much of the material being turned into highway <u>guardrail spacer blocks</u>, among other items.

Here are step-by-step instructions on how to properly prepare boat shrink wrap for recycling:

- 1. **Start at the bottom:** Cut and remove all bellybands at the bottom of the shrink wrap. Bellybands are the strapping that runs under the hull that keeps the shrink wrap from lifting off the boat.
- 2. **Make four cuts:** Starting at the stern, make a vertical cut on the edge of the shrink wrap cover about 6 inches tall, which will loosen the bottom perimeter of the wrap. Continue to make three more vertical cuts on the perimeter at port and starboard midships and at the bow. You should now have four cuts.
- 3. Pull out the nylon: Remove the four pieces of nylon perimeter banding from the sleeve at the bottom perimeter of the shrink wrap.
- 4. **Cut up, gently:** Working from the stern to the bow, begin cutting up the wrap into smaller sizes for removal. Start about 6- to 8 feet up and make a downward vertical cut on the boat's centerline toward the bottom of the stern, being careful to not make contact with the boat. Then, moving forward on both sides of the boat, make additional cuts to remove the wrap in reasonably-sized pieces.
- 5. **Think clean, clean:** As the pieces of shrink wrap come off the boat, be careful not to contaminate them with dirt, oil, stones or other contaminants. It's very important that all nylon strapping, banding, buckles, plastic vents, door zippers or any other materials attached to the wrap are removed and disposed of separately. If, by chance, you've patched your wrap with a tape that can't be removed, cut that portion out and dispose of it separately.
- 6. **Roll and dispose:** Roll up the pieces of shrink wrap so they can be easily managed by recyclers. You can cut off a long narrow piece of wrap (sometimes called "film") to tie up the bundles but again, use only shrink wrap material to do this; avoid twine, duct tape or rope. Next, place the bundles in your marina, yard or boat club's designated shrink wrap recycling area and you're done!

To find out how to recycle shrink wrap in your area, check out your local <u>Clean Marina</u> program or marine trades association. Shrink wrap manufacturer Dr. Shrink also offers a REBAG <u>shrink wrap recycling</u> kit for \$45 that contains a 30- by 50-inch clear bag with cover-removal directions printed on it, a closure device for the bag and a prepaid FedEx shipping label. The kit can recycle the wrap from a 26-foot power boat, or approximately 600 square feet.

"Across the Arctic Ocean and to Antarctica by Icebreaker"

Presentation on Thursday, May 23rd at 7pm: "On August 22, 1994, USCGC POLAR SEA (WAGB 11) became the first United States surface ship to reach the North Pole in what was the first major scientific crossing of the Arctic Ocean. Following that expedition, POLAR SEA deployed to McMurdo Sound in Antarctica, reaching one of the southern-most parts of the Southern Ocean. This presentation will cover the two voyages, reviewing the science supported by the Coast Guard's most powerful icebreaker, and providing pictures of some of the scenery in the polar regions of the world."
