Satkowski, 6-year old 1st grade grandson of member John Kauffman, was the grand prize winner, catching 22 fish. Other winners were 2nd grader Zach O'Dell, first fish caught at less than 3 seconds after start; 2nd grader Logan Kowalski, smallest fish- 4.5" bluegill; 6th grader Garrett Worden, biggest bass- 16"; and 1st grader Wyatt Dornberg, biggest bluegill- 7.5". Congratulations to all winners! Everyone had a great time.

We couldn't have done it without you!



The World Maritime Day, designated by the United Nations, will be held on September 30. With that in mind, MBC-A will offer (we hope) the Maritime Career Day once again (YEA) at the end of September (Day TBD) in collaboration with the Monroe Public Schools Career Center. Until we are certain the MPS will permit the event, it is tentatively scheduled. The

MICHIGAN ENVIRONMENTAL COUNCIL

In recent weeks a proposal to spend an additional \$150 million in American Rescur Plan funds to improve infrastructure at local parks across Michigan has been announced. The proposal would create a program administered by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources that seeks to enhance the economies, health, and recovery of local communities across the state. Michigan currently has about 4,000 local parks. The MEC is a strong advocate to ensure the total of \$400 million in park improvement is included in the budget. The passage of Proposal 1 will fund parks across the state in perpetuity through the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund.



Pre-Departure Safety Checklist

Pre-Departure Safety Checklist

Passengers

- Does anyone on land know who all your passengers are so that all are accounted for in case of an accident?
- Does everyone know basic man overboard drills?
- Have you informed everyone about the expected weather and sea conditions?
- Do passengers know how to safely board the vessel?
- Do you have at least one fitting Coast Guard approved life vest per passenger?
- Do your passengers know where they are and how to put them on?
- Do children and adolescents have appropriately-sized PFDs?

Electronics & Lights – are they all in working order?

- Main battery – check to ensure it is charged and holding a charge
- Spare batteries for any accessories, such as a radio or flashlight
- Marine radio
- Depth Finder
- GPS
- Nav and Anchor Lights
- Instrument Lights
- Deck Lights
- Flashlight

Do you Have the Following?

- Day and night distress signals, if applicable
- First aid kit
- Blanket in case of man-overboard, shock, illness, etc.
- Toolbox of tools and spare parts for emergency boat repairs
- Fire extinguisher – inspect it to make sure it is operational and full
- A horn capable of producing a four-second blast audible for at least 1/2 mile
- A heaving line or throwable flotation device, such as life ring
- A manual dewatering device

Fuel and Oil

- Are your tanks topped-off?
- Check the oil: Is it full? Clean?

Readying the Boat for Launching

- Blower is on for 5 minutes to get fumes out of engine compartment (use your nose to check for fumes)
- Hatches are closed
- Drain plug is closed

Final Check Before Leaving the Dock

- Check and start engine(s)
- Ensure charging system is working
- Check to make sure bilges are reasonably dry and bilge pump is operational




