**From the DNR...** Eight different species, 672,478 fish, weighing in at nearly 13.5 tons – those are the totals from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources' fall 2021 fish stocking efforts at 123 locations across the state. Several fisheries management units (Northern Lake Michigan, Southern Lake Michigan, Central Lake Michigan, Lake Erie and Southern Lake Huron) stocked fall fingerling walleyes in 2021. The Lake Erie and Southern and Central Lake Michigan management units stocked 23,133 Muskegon strain fall fingerlings weighing 2,108 pounds. Three sites were stocked with a

total of 5,035 channel catfish from Ohio, with a total weight of 1,014 pounds. These fish were part of an annual agreement that includes Michigan providing Ohio with steelhead eggs in exchange for fall fingerling channel catfish.

Warning about the state of the lake with fluctuating temperatures that Michigan has been experiencing. When temperatures reach 40 degrees across the southern lower peninsula, please check the ice carefully before venturing out. Warm spells may weaken the ice and then cause it to refreeze at night, making it unstable.

There are about 1,300 seasonal park worker positions available the DNR announced this month. If you have children or grandchildren who might be interested, take note. **The Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy** and Gov. Whitmer declared the month of January 2022 Radon Action Month. She encourages all Michigan residents to learn more about radon, an environmental hazard, and test their homes during the heating season. Beyond smoking, radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer and considered a leading environmental cause of cancer deaths in the U.S. The UPA estimates that radon is responsible for about 20,000 lung cancer deaths in U.S. each year.
