A reminder that all first-year vessels that are docked at MBC, the owner is required to obtain a current year Coast Guard Auxiliary Marine Vessel Safety Check and display the exam decal on the vessel accordance with the prescribed regulations. MBC- also

strongly recommends that all vessels occupying a dock at MBC have a current VSC. Dock holders or renters have until July 30th to comply with this rule. Dock holders and or renters failing to comply with this rule will be fined one dollar each day they are not in compliance after July 30th. This is per section 2 paragraph 27 of the dock rules.

Our own John G. is setting up on June 18th with fellow USCG Auxiliarists to do FREE Vessel Safety Checks. Times will be posted on the board along with notification thru Facebook and emails. Looking forward to some safe boating.

### NEWS

**Book Club:** Judy Peterson writes, At the Book Club Meeting on May 4, we discussed our selection One Italian Summer by Rebecca Serle. None of us thought it was a good read and we do not recommend this book.

We have decided to read two books for June. The first is Mercy by David Baldacci, and the second is The Wife Upstairs by Freida McFadden. Let's hope we will enjoy some good books and some good weather this month!!! Our next meeting will be held on June 1, 2022 at noon at MBC. Please come and join us!!!

**Safety Check.** It might be as warm as 85 degrees during Memorial Day week, but the lake's water is still a chilly 60 degrees. If someone goes overboard in water that cold, even a healthy adult will struggle. In 60-degree water as it quickly becomes difficult to control your breathing and use the muscles in your arms and legs.

**The Environmental Career Day for 7th graders** was held on May 24th and 25th. 100 students, 50 students and 4 teachers the first day and the same number the second day. The two groups traded places, going to Monroe County Community College and led by River Raisin Institute. The day at MCCC was spent visiting the technology labs and learning about terrestrial invasive species, and conserving water. The MBC day included the importance of clean water for Lake Erie boating and commercialization, and the impact of invasive species on fish. The impact of invasive species coming into airports and ports was illustrated with examples and demonstrations by the Agricultural Specialists of the U.S. Customs and Border Protection and their two dogs. Day one weather cooperated beautifully, and the kids got onto boats, many of them for the first time, and for many, seeing Lake Erie for the first time. They motored out to the lake, collected water, and returned to analyze it for pH and nitrates. They also had the opportunity to test for phosphorous, dissolved oxygen, and turbidity. The second day was not so kind with winds and sprinkles so boating was limited to talking with the captains and sitting on the boats along with the other activities mentioned for the MBC day above.

**From the DNR...**Want to help Michigan with cleaner air and water? Want to provide cooling summer shade and a haven for wildlife? Pick a tree out at your local nursery, plant it and then pin it on the [DNR's interactive map!](#)

- Spring and fall are best for planting trees. Staff at local nurseries can help you choose a tree from their inventories that will thrive where you want to put it.
- Consider the size your tree will be when it is fully grown and plant an appropriate distance from your house or other buildings and away from power lines. These [tips from the Arbor Day Foundation](#) can help you make the right selection.
- Consider planting native trees, which provide food and cover for wildlife.
- Water your tree daily during the first week, then weekly afterward. You want a balance; enough water but not too much. If the ground feels wet, you may not need to water.
- Once you plant your tree, go to our interactive online map and [log in your tree](#).

**From MSU Extension...**Spongy moth (formerly gypsy moth) is an important invasive pest of many forest and shade trees in Michigan. Spongy moth has become established in all Michigan counties and most of the state has experienced one or more spongy moth outbreaks. Spongy moth caterpillars have pairs of red and blue spots along the back and long, dark hairs. They feed on leaves of oaks and other preferred host trees including aspen, apple, basswood, birch, crabapple, willow and many other types of trees in early and mid-summer, usually from mid- or late May until early July. An oak or other hardwood tree that is completely defoliated by spongy moth caterpillars may look as if it's dead. However, most of these trees will "re-flush" and produce a second set of leaf buds, usually by late July. Search for spongy moth egg masses on trees, firewood and outdoor furniture. Scrape egg masses into a bucket or similar container filled with soapy water, or burn or bury the egg masses.

The Great Lakes are beloved by many people and in many ways define the quality of life for Michiganders. Michigan is the only state nestled in the center of a freshwater ecosystem that accounts for 20% of the planet's fresh surface water. Michigan has over 275,000

acres of Great Lakes coastal wetlands but has lost approximately 50% of the coastal wetlands that existed prior to European settlement. In some parts of the state, losses are as high as 90%.

## **MBC-A (501c3) Update**

The International Order of the Blue Gavel Humanitarian Foundation provides the boating community the ability to create real differences in others' lives. The foundation provides resources to existing charities and benefits communities through new initiatives involving boating activities and education. The opportunity to make a difference for another's life is one of the greater human satisfactions. The IOBGHF is committed to provide opportunities for participation for people to conveniently select a cause, which means something special to them.

**The 5th and 6th Grade Fishing Club** received proceeds of \$500.00 from the Humanitarian Foundation to purchase youth life jackets to keep children safe as they fish on LaPlainsance Creek, the Hoffman Fishing site, and onboard boats. They were purchased from local chandlery Trout's Yacht Basin.

On May 24, two professional walleye tournament fishermen returned to MBC with their boats to take the kids out on the water. Both captains hold charter licenses and provided their time and boats at no cost for the kids.

Humanitarian Foundation Past President and current Director Larry Inguagiato along with Ambassador Mary Kay were on hand to meet the children and see the positive impact the donation has on our area's youth. Thank you to the IOBG Humanitarian Foundation and the Inguagiato's for your support and generosity!

On May 12th there were 84 kids that attended the "**Meet the Pro Fisherman Night**" for all MBC and area kids and parents. Michigan Walleye Tour professional fishermen welcomed the kids onboard their boats, gave them hats, t-shirts, lures and each received a brand-new rod and reel the Thursday before the Michigan Walleye Tournament at MBC. In addition, the pro anglers produced an interactive session with the children, including a lesson about underwater topography and why fish go to certain areas of lakes rather than others.

Coordinating all those kids was a big accomplishment! A big Thank You to Jenny Francisco for coordinating our club and local kids, Nicole Schaughnessey for coordinating the Monroe School kids, Jamie O'Brien brought along the Fishing Club kids, and Charlotte Neuhauser provided snacks and refreshments for the kids.






