September is here, and the 2022 boating season is beginning to wind down here on the Great Lakes. There have been some exciting events taking place in the last month at MBC. The Sail Fleet hosted its annual Solo Challenge Race on Saturday, August 13.

For this event, only one person is allowed on each boat, who must complete the race unaided on the 11 nautical mile course, Lee Elekonich on Yeah Buoy finished in first place, Andrew Devenish on Kopite took second, Dan Sadoski on Liberty third, and David Buchko on Wind Climber finished fourth. It is quite an accomplishment for these sailors to use their sailing skills to successfully master the racecourse alone on their boats.

On Sunday, August 21, MBC Sail Fleet held its annual Ladies Race, which requires at least 50% of each boat's crew to be women, with a lady at the helm at all times. The ladies had to overcome very light winds of 4 to 6 knots as well as rain. In the Jam A class Jess Norris and the crew of Yuk Fou II took first in class as well as first overall.

Kim Stange and crew on Relentless finished second. In the JAM B class, Erin Jeruzal and Barb Montgomery took first place on One Boob Up, followed by Michelle Ranville and crew on Vagi in second place, and Lisa Fitzsimmons and crew on Lilly Ann finishing third. The after-race cookout and awards presentation at the club had a good turnout and was a lot of fun.

MBC-A (501c3) Update

The MBC-Association is the club's 501(c)3 arm, and as a charitable non-profit organization the MBC-A is able to provide programs and resources that are not funded through the club's General Fund.

This September, MBC-A resumes the longstanding partnership with the Monroe Schools with the resumption of the Maritime Career Day for High School students, the second full year of the 5th and 6th Grade Fishing Club, and we introduce brand-new Weather and Atmospheric program for High School girls.

The Grade school Fishing Club resumes for its second year under Head Coach Jamie O'Brien. There are returning students from last year already signed up, and a Parents Orientation will be in the Back Room on Sept 12 for new participants. The Fishing Club will meet the second and fourth Mondays each month from 4 to 6pm until Christmas break.

The Fishing Club curriculum is based on the national "Hooked on Fishing, Not on Drugs" program developed by the Future Fisherman Foundation. This includes instruction on fish biology, ethics, children's life skills and self-confidence as well as fishing. Club members help as assistant coaches, along with Professional Fishermen from the springtime Walleye Tournament.

MBC-A provides all the rods, reels, lures, bait, life jackets and tackle boxes for each child. As they leave the program at the end of the 6th grade, each student gets to keep their rod, reel and tackle boxes they have used, provided at no cost to the family.

Citizen Help... The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development is asking for the public's help by being on the lookout for spotted lanternfly, an invasive insect with the potential to seriously affect Michigan's agriculture and natural resources. This insect feeds on more than 70 different plants including grapes, apples, and hardwood trees. It was first detected in Pennsylvania and now is in Ohio. Dead lanternflies have been found in Michigan in packaging shipped from other states. If you drive to other states, check your car or camping equipment for adults or egg masses. "With the current rate of spread, it is possible spotted lanternfly could reach Michigan at any time," said Miller, the invasive species expert. "Public awareness and reporting are essential to early detection, which provides the opportunity to contain an infestation before it becomes a widespread problem." From late summer to the first hard frost, spotted lanternflies are in their adult stage and easiest to identify. Adults are roughly one inch long. Their folded wings are gray to brown with black spots. Open wings reveal a yellow and black abdomen and bright red hind wings with black spots transitioning to black and white bands at the edge.

One other item... the new Michigan Department of Natural Resources hunting and fishing app is now available for download to Apple and Android devices. The free Michigan DNR Hunt Fish app offers a convenient way for anglers and other outdoor enthusiasts to buy fishing licenses and trail permits.

On September 28, the Maritime Career Day will introduce students to potential employment in the marine industry. The high schoolers will visit with area employers to learn about jobs including freighters and shipping at the Port of Monroe, underwater diving with Solomon Brothers, engine and diesel repair at Trouts, yacht sales at Reeds/Toledo Beach Marina and more. Several students have earned well-paying jobs through this program.

MBC-A has developed a brand-new program for High School girls, focusing on Weather and Atmospheric Sciences that will be held on Sept 21 and 22. The NOAA Detroit office is partnering with this program, which also includes female professionals from corporations, academia and the public sectors. This program will provide STEM based instruction for approx 20 students who have applied to attend the course and have been recommended by their teachers. The second day the young women will board sailboats provided by the North Cape Sailing School and experience the weather principals from the classroom in a practical way on the water.

All these programs do cost money to produce; they are not funded by the Club. MBC-A earns money by managing "Poker Nights" through the State of Michigan Gaming Commission. We have a poker event coming up October 20-23 at Vision Lanes in Westland MI which is just 35 minutes from MBC. We could use some help redeeming poker chips and have several 4-hour shifts that need to be filled. You earn MBC Work Hours for this, as well as earning direct cash income for MBC-A.

If your application is turned in after Labor Day, storage space will only be awarded if available.


Per Club Rules:

- B) Applications received after Labor Day will be awarded space as available.
- C) All applications shall include a signed Agreement, Proof of Insurance and applicable fee.
- D) Owner shall clearly identify the item with the Owners Name.**
