The MBC-Association is the club's 501(c)3 arm, and as a charitable non-profit organization the MBC-A is able to provide programs and resources that are not funded through the club's General Fund. This year, MBC-A paid the club \$4,500.00 for future facility usage rentals.

Looking back on this year, MBC-A produced Six different programs. Three were primarily MBC oriented, and three impacted young people in the Monroe area. MBC Association positively impacted 161 families, and 168 MBC and community members volunteered for these projects.

--Regatta Kids Fishing Derby has occurred for over 17 years and 20 kids participated in this year's July event

--Masters Walleye Circuit brought professional fishermen from across the country to MBC for a Thursday-Friday-Saturday event in April.

--Boat Shrink Wrap Recycling Program tripled in size this year in coordination with the Michigan Sea Grant and Michigan Recycling Coalition to reduce plastics going into the landfill.

--Maritime Career Day introduced 31 Monroe High School 12th grade students and 3 teachers to potential employment in the marine industry in September.

--Environmental Career Day provided 91 7th Graders with exposure to various professions and careers related to the Great Lakes and coastal ecology in June.

## MBC Yard Master Update

The storage yard is in very nice shape thanks to the work of Rick Campbell and Fritz Peterson. Boats, trailers, RV's and other items are organized and tidy, and our members are disposing debris in the proper locations. Thank you!

The Yard will be full this winter, and boats are close together. The MBC Board has recognized the potential for shrink-wrapping accidents and has approved the following Shrink-Wrap Procedures. NOTE that it is the OWNER of the boat who is ultimately responsible to ensure these procedures are followed:

Before the shrinking process begins, it is the boat owner's responsibility to see that <u>all the</u> <u>following conditions exist within an area of 10 feet surrounding the boat to be shrink-</u><u>wrapped.</u>

A. Outside Contractors must have adequate liability insurance on file with Monroe Boat Club.

B. All fuel tank vents, including fuel vents on adjacent boats within10 feet, are to be temporarily sealed with tape. (Note 10 foot rule above)

C. A fully charged fire extinguisher type ABC minimum UL rating 4A:60B:C (minimum 10 lb with hose) will be in the close proximity of the vessel being wrapped.

D. Minimum of one helper / observer present.

E. A ladder, scaffold, or similar platform to provide a safe, sturdy means of reaching all areas of the vessel that requires the shrinking process.

F. MBC equipment is not to be used to comply with these conditions.

G. Tape must be removed from the adjacent boat fuel vents when shrink wrapping is completed.

H. Shrink wrapping is to be done during daylight hours only.


I. Shrink wrap is to be disposed into Michigan Recycling Bags, which can be purchased from MBC, your contractor, or Dr. Shrink Inc. If Recycling Bags are not used, the Owner is responsible for removing all material from the MBC Yard. MBC does not allow plastic wrap in club dumpsters.
