


### Commodore – Carl Butler


## Rear Commodore – Carl Laura

Remember there are other Regattas going on at other clubs and at MBC. See the AYC board in the hallway for dates and times. Go check them out during these festive times and "Have Fun"!




### Sail Fleet Capt. - Dan Montgomery

## **MBC Yard Master Update**

Winter boat storage is approaching quickly! Turn in your storage agreement now.

You are guaranteed space if your application and fee are turned in *before* Labor Day. If your application is turned in *after* Labor Day, storage space will only be awarded if available.

The Yard is in great shape and has been re-surfaced this year. There is power and water available for your winterizing needs, and The Yard continues to be secured and lit at night. And the best news is that prices remain the same!

MBC Members receive a lower storage rate than the I-LYA/AYC customer contract found on the public part of the club website. *Don't use the wrong form!* 

Please download the Members storage contract in the <u>"Members"</u> tab of the club website www.monroeboatclub.org or directly here <u>Members Storage Contract</u>

Documents can be mailed to MBC or dropped into the slot in the wooden mailbox in the Commodore's Room (access via the door near the BBQ Pavilion). You must be sure to mark your trailer, cradle or boat with your name so we can identify it.

#### Per Club Rules:

- A) When the storage lot is at full capacity and applications (with fee and proof of insurance) are received by Labor Day, any available space will first go to MBC members who stored on club grounds the previous year, secondly to other MBC members and then to AYC/I-LYA members, then to others.
- B) Applications received after Labor Day will be awarded space as available.
- C) All applications shall include a signed Agreement, Proof of Insurance and applicable fee.
- D) Owner shall clearly identify the item with the Owners Name.
